## **Creativity** — Selecting & thumbnailing

Most of our ideas are terrible.


This means that you want to be able to generate as many ideas as possible. Remember that only about 10% of your ideas are going to be worth looking at. So if you want to have to best chance of generating something good, you should come up with **as many ideas as possible**.

And then you go back and select the best ones.

When narrow down your ideas, keep the following things in mind:

- Intentionally choose the more unusual ideas. Avoid the easy ideas that are common.
- Choose the most detailed ideas. These will tend to be more unique as well.
- Keep your mind open so that you don't do the same thing that has been done before.
- Combine things in unusual ways. You might like "fish" and "handbags", but someone carrying a fish-shaped handbag is neat!
- Target the top 10%.
